PLEASE READ YOUR RESERVATION CONFIRMATION CAREFULLY & BE SURE TO REVIEW THE COUNCIL POLICY ON CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS.

1. The capacity listed for each facility is the **maximum** capacity. Attendance in excess of stated occupancy will require either rental of a supplemental tent site, or, the unit must be prepared to tent on the grounds of the rented facility. Attendees in excess of the maximum capacity will be charged a fee of \$1.00 per person.
2. All units must check-in with the camp ranger and have a campsite reservation. Report any damages found at check-in immediately. A unit roster must be submitted at check-in with the signature of the “on site” leader.
3. All non-GNYC Units must submit a Local Tour Plan at Check-in. All Cub Scout Units must have a BALOO trained leader in attendance.
4. Use only those areas assigned to your unit.
5. Any check written for payments of fees, damage, supplies, etc. must show the name, address and phone number of the person writing the check. This includes unit checks.
6. Units need to supply their own water containers, garbage bags, etc.
7. Report any accident or injury to the Camp Ranger immediately. The Camp Ranger can supply emergency medical facility information. The Key leader should have a current health history for each Scout with them.
8. Do not climb on roofs or through the windows of any of our camp buildings or over any fences.
9. Garbage must be taken to assigned areas.
10. Units should leave a courtesy supply of firewood (enough for one full night) upon checking out.
11. All units must check out with a Camp Ranger, Campmaster, or their designee. Additional fees for damage, propane, etc. will be collected at this time. A Scout is “Clean” and the general rule is to always leave camp a little better than when you arrived. All loaned equipment must be returned in good, clean, working condition.
12. The following are **not allowed** at camp for the safety and enjoyment of all campers: pets, fireworks, personal guns, rifles, bows, arrows, slingshots or other weapons, sheath knives or machetes, chainsaws, snowmobiles, dirt bikes, motorcycles, ATVs or other motorized vehicles, alcoholic beverages, drugs or controlled substances.
13. The use of liquid fuel lamps and stoves is restricted at camp. Liquid fuel may only be used on backcountry trips (e.g., a trek) or when training people who will be using liquid fuel on backcountry trips. All use of liquid fuel must be done under close adult supervision. Propane gas appliances may be used only by adult leaders. Please be very careful with the “empty” canisters. They can explode if they are exposed to heat. Campfires must be built in established campfire rings only. Keep fires small, never leave them unattended, and be sure they are “cold out” when finished.
14. Do not cut or injure any standing tree or shrub. Do not ditch tents or dig holes for any purpose. Do not kill or abuse any wildlife.
15. No swimming is permitted in any pool, lake, river or other waterfront unless under the supervision of Council staff.
16. All units must observe the 11 PM curfew.
17. Cancellations 45 days or more prior to the date scheduled receive a full refund or credit. Cancellations 21 days or more before the scheduled date receive a full credit. Cancellations 14 days or more before the scheduled date receive a 50% credit. “No Shows” forfeit the full amount of the reservation fee. Credits are valid for six months and can be used for payment of weekend camping fees at any GNYC camp.
18. A \$20 processing fee is charged for all returned checks.

TIPS FOR MAKING A SUCCESSFUL SHORT TERM RESERVATION

1. An online reservation system is in place for all three camps, which may be accessed through bsa-gnyc.org. One primary contact is assigned for each unit, and only this person will be issued a user name and password.
2. The online reservation system will show you immediately what facilities are available. By accessing this during planning meetings, you will be able to make on-the-spot adjustments to your camping calendar. Always search for 2 nights to see availability; always start your reservation with Friday night, even if arriving Saturday.
3. Reserve Early! Reservations can be made up to 12 months in advance for GNYC units, and 11 months in advance for other BSA units. While reservations for tent sites, lean-tos, picnics and day trips can usually be accommodated, cabin reservations for the months of October through April fill up far in advance. The online reservation system is *not* available for reservations made between 11 and 12 months in advance. GNYC units must do this by phone.
4. The Short Term Camping Reservations number is available for problems with online reservations and other general issues, at 212-651-3077. When leaving a message, be as detailed as possible, including your Unit Number, Council, and District. Your call will be returned as soon as possible, in the order it was received.
5. The confirmation copy is sent to your e-mail address immediately. Please read it carefully. It contains information regarding the date, camp facility, amount due and the council policy regarding refunds and cancellations. If you do not receive your confirmation, we may have an incorrect e-mail address. In that case, please call Short Term Camping. The confirmation also includes a link to the weekend roster form.
6. You have 15 days after the reservation is made to make your payment. If payment is not received, your reservation may be cancelled and the site given to someone else.

LEADERSHIP POLICY FOR ALL B.S.A. TRIPS AND OUTINGS! ! !

Two registered adult leaders, or one adult leader and a parent of a participating Scout, one of whom must be at least 21 years of age or older, are required for all trips or outings. Co-ed overnight activities require male and female adult leadership. It is the responsibility of the chartered organization of any Pack, Troop, Post, Team, Crew or Ship to ensure the unit committee and other leadership provides sufficient leadership on all trips and outings.

The "safety rule of four" requires that no fewer than four individuals (always with the minimum of two adults) go on overnight campout. If an accident occurs, one person stays with the injured, and two go for help.

Male and female leaders require separate sleeping facilities. Married couples may share the same quarters if appropriate facilities are available.

Male and female youth participants will not share the same facility. When staying in tents, no youth will stay in the tent of an adult other than his or her parent or guardian.
